Some Changes

- At the annual meeting in May, Mary Sheldon was elected as a new trustee. She also serves as a member of the Program Committee.
- Inflation has arrived. The price of the "Hard Times Cookbook" has increased to \$10.00. The large maps of Nobleboro are now \$5.00. The Town's History book price stays the same at \$15.00

New Facelift for the Historical Center

This project was deferred to another year. The Town was hard pressed with an increase in taxes. The Society now has a building reserve of \$4,310 available to assist on the costs of the facelift.

Additional Contribution of Artifacts

The Society has now received a total of 923 items since its organization 25 years ago. Two recent important contributions were 20 volumes of "The Maine Register" covering the years between 1886 and 1927 and records of meetings of Nobleboro's School Union during 1918 – 1965.

Sharing History

A special enjoyment was meeting with 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} graders to answer their questions on Nobleboro history. Of major interest was the family and farm operation, long ago, where the school now stands.

The Open House at the Historical Center for grades 3, 5, and 7 was postponed from a busy June schedule to this fall.

There has been much continuing demand by those seeking their ancestral roots, from our genealogical records, including home and cemetery locations.

Visitors at the Historical Center have been rather small in number during the Saturday afternoons in the busy months of July and August. However, a considerable number of visitors are welcomed by special appointments throughout the year.
