These are Memorial Funds of \$11,240 (up \$175 over a year ago), Scholarships of \$9,165 (up \$1,165) and the general fund of \$18,796 (up \$2,274). This \$2,274 is our net operating income for the year.

Income from membership dues this year was \$1,925 up from \$968 last year. The extra income was the result of the increase in dues and the addition of three new Life Members of \$100 each  $\sim$  James Birkett, Betsey Birkett Hall, and Beverly Hancock.
