Over the years the Damariscotta Mills Fish Ladder Restoration Committee has done outstanding work on the difficult, on-going job of restoring the fish ladder and has wonderful community involvement. Since the Committee is about preserving history – the ladder and the Mills – and was thinking about becoming an historical organization and 501(c)(3), NHS suggested we join together – and they said 'yes.' It is an excellent merger, as the organizations have qualities that match or complement & are fun.
